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

MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Central Intelligence

SUBJECT: Forecast of Military Personnel Requirements, Fiscal Year 1955.

1. It is requested that forecasts of the military personnel requirements of your activity for Fiscal Year 1955 be prepared for consolidation and forwarding to the Department of Defense on or about 1 February 1954.

2. The following details will be necessary:

- a. Parent service from which personnel are required (Army, Navy, Air Force, or Marine Corps).
- b. Requirements for officers, warrant officers, and enlisted men.
- c. Whether officer positions are reimbursable or non-reimbursable (paramilitary).
- d. Required commissioned grades for reimbursable officers (for CIA budgeting).
- e. Designation of positions as "Departmental" or "Field".

3. The total number of reimbursable man-years in each officer grade must necessarily be reconciled with the total of Agency funds which have been budgeted for military reimbursement during Fiscal Year 1955. Accordingly, it will be assumed that any appreciable increase or reduction in your military requirements between 30 June 1954 (Fiscal Year 1954 authorization) and 30 June 1955 (estimated Fiscal Year 1955 requirements) will be spread uniformly throughout the fiscal year. If it can be shown that this will not be the case, a schedule, by quarter, of your military buildup or cutback will be most helpful in computing dollar costs.

4.  of this Division,  will assist wherever possible in the compilation of your estimated requirements.
