WORLD SCOPE ENCYCLOPEDIA

Central Intelligence Agency, a Federal Agency established in 1947, pursuant to section 102 of the National Security Act of 1947. The Director of Central Intelligence is the head of the Agency, which is under the direction of the National Security Council. The Agency is charged with coordinating the intelligence activities of the Government, in the interest of national Security. The law specifically provides that the Agency shall have no police, subpoena, or law-enforcement powers, or internal security functions. However, the Director is responsible for protecting intelligence sources and methods from unauthorized disclosure.
