

Dear General Keyes:

In response to the request contained in your letter dated October 13, 1952, we are proposing to the Intelligence Advisory Committee the initiation of a special estimate covering the minimum annual civilian petroleum requirements of the USSR and Satellites in the event of a general war in 1954, with tentative date of completion on or before December 15, 1952.

As you doubtless know, the Director of Central Intelligence and, through him, the Intelligence Advisory Committee are responsible to the National Security Council and the time of the IAC estimators is largely occupied with priority tasks set by the Council. While we are glad to assist agencies of the Department of Defense by furnishing intelligence which transcends the capabilities of any single department or agency, our acceptance of such requirements must be understood to be subject to priority tasks which may be set by the National Security Council.

To what extent the Soviets could reduce their civilian consumption is not known, but probably well below the cold-war estimate of requirements.
