MEMORANDUM FOR: THE DEPUTY SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

SUBJECT : Breakdown of Soviet Aircraft Strength, by Types

With respect to our recent conversation concerning the Soviet Air Force, the table below contains the current joint Air Force-Navy breakdown of the estimated over-all Soviet aircraft strength of 20,000 planes. In substance, this breakdown has been the basis for formally agreed National Estimates on this subject, concurred in by each of the Intelligence Advisory Committee agencies.

At the present time, three of the Intelligence Advisory Committee agencies are reviewing previous estimates of Soviet jet fighter production, and these studies, when completed, may lead to a change in the foregoing estimated breakdown.
