Dear Jack:

I am sorry that it has taken so long to answer your letter of December 8th regarding the estimates prepared in the Office of Reports and Estimates being transmitted on to your office. The transmittal of these estimates was discontinued for a while because they progressed from a secret to a top secret classification, and there was always the great fear that although the papers were stamped as working papers they might get out as evaluated and coordinated information.

I have talked to our people, and we are going back to the procedure that obtained previously. We shall send these papers over, and they will be stamped as WORKING PAPERS, but would you please communicate with your people and emphasize that they are WORKING PAPERS, uncoordinated even within our own shop. I trust that this arrangement will be satisfactory.
