Dear Congressman Busbey:

This will acknowledge your letter, dated 3 August 1948, requesting certain data regarding [redacted] who is an employee of this Agency. The answers to your questions, set forth in the same order as reference inquiry, are as follows:

1. He is employed as an Intelligence Officer on the Plans Staff. 25X1

2. [redacted]

3. The position which he occupies is an Excepted Civil Service appointment under Schedule A of the Civil Service Rules and Regulations, and the Classification Act of 1923, as amended.

4. His appointment is technically considered to be permanent, but can be terminated at any time in accordance with Civil Service Rules and Regulations and the Veterans Preference Act of 1944.

5. His position is not considered temporary.

6. His appointment was not made subject to any condition.

7. He was cleared on loyalty by the Office of Strategic Services' Security Branch before being appointed to the government service.

8. This Agency has received a report of investigation from the Federal Bureau of Investigation on him.

9. The individual has been cleared of charge of disloyalty by a Central Intelligence Agency loyalty board. His case is now being reviewed by a Central Intelligence Agency security board which will submit recommendations as to whether he should be dismissed (under authority granted me by Congress) as a security risk. I expect to receive the board's recommendation within a week. When my decision has been made, I shall be happy to advise you of same. 25X1
