I think you can safely assure [redacted] that the American intelligence service is not overlooking so important a source of information as is described in the article. However, security prohibits a full disclosure of the steps which are being taken to exploit such information, but I can inform you personally that the sources mentioned have been extensively tapped for some time, and that we are continuing to make use of them.
