Dear Senator Millikin:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 2 May 1953 regarding the circumstances in the resignation of [redacted] from the Central Intelligence Agency.

STAT

[redacted] resigned on 26 November 1952 for two stated reasons. The first was financial, as [redacted] found it increasingly difficult to raise several children on a Government salary. For some time prior to his resignation he had considered going into private industry, and I understand he has now done so. The second reason for his resignation was medical, in that he suffered from an asthmatic condition, which was not improved by the Washington climate.

While I do not know the nature of the inquiry which you have received concerning [redacted] I can state that, so far as we know, his resignation was prompted only by the reasons set forth above.
