What on earth are you all trying to do by proposing public investigations of any of our Intelligence Agencies?

If you have some reason to believe the head of an agency is not doing the job required of him, or that he is inadequate, or outlived his usefulness, of course he should be replaced (but quietly NOT through a public investigation). If his organization has personnel any of you have true facts to believe such personnel have failed in their duties, or are no longer trustworthy, nor able to do a job expected of them, then you all should ask the head of that agency to clean up whatever mess has been made, relieve their Department of such unsuitable persons--quietly--not a Public Investigation.

But to flaunt a Senate on Congressional Public Investigation of any such agencies is NOT only absolutely wrong, and un-American procedure, BUT also shakes to the core our countrymen's confidence in US Government and denigrates the image of Congress, disgraced in the eyes of the world as well as immediately ruining confidence in America.

Such shortsighted (public procedure) of investigating our Foreign or Domestic Intelligence and Security agencies is stupid madness.

For our Country's and God's Sake, WAKE UP!

Leave whatever methods seem necessary to the wisdom of all Intelligence agencies to obtain information in any, or every way possible, if it is to help keep all harm or shadow of a doubt of harm, to come to our National Security.

BUT


