Dear Dick:

Have been at home for several weeks with the flu, but I went to an executive meeting of the Charlottesville Committee, Council of Foreign Relations, on Tuesday.

I learned that the Executive Secretary, Dr. E. F. Puryan, Jr., had written Mr. Colby asking him to talk to the Committee on 10 January, 1976. I am the Chairman of our local group.

This is probably an impossible request for him to accept considering the situation on the Hill and in the Agency. But our Committee is interested in helping the CIA in anyway we can. The Congress has so many pressing problems. I cannot see these continuing investigations are in the national interest.

The purpose of this note is to support the Committee request for Mr. Colby's help if he wants to escape the Washington area for a day - and alternatively to suggest that can he not make it - and you might be able to do so, that you come down. Then I'd love to have you stay the night here at the farm with me. I can promise good food, peace and quiet.

My place is but five miles from U.S. 29, the most direct route from Washington to Charlottesville. It is about 100 miles from Middle River to Fort Myer.

Hopefully you will all have a respite with the Congressional recess over the Holidays.
