In General Smith's absence, I am taking the liberty of replying to your letter to him of December 21st with regard to [Redacted] delegates to the recent Moral Rearmament Assembly in Washington. Your letter reached General Smith as he was leaving on a rather extended trip and he therefore asked me to see that these gentlemen were contacted by an appropriate officer of this Agency and that I advise you of the results of the meeting.

Due to change of plans, [Redacted] did not attend the conference. However, one of General Smith's assistant directors had a luncheon meeting with [Redacted] on January 6th. I have been advised that our representative was very favorably impressed with [Redacted] unusual background and of his sincere belief in the efficacy of his Moral Rearmament program. I believe that the meeting was profitable to both parties and it is only to be regretted that General Smith was not able to receive [Redacted] personally.
