Dear Air Vice Marshal Dunlap:

Just as General Smith was leaving on a short trip, he asked me to acknowledge and thank you for your letter of March 17, 1952, concerning his speaking at the National Defence College on "Strategic Intelligence and the Organization of the Central Intelligence Agency." General Smith purposely delayed replying to your letter in order to determine whether or not his schedule would permit him to do this.

He now finds that he will be able to come to Kingston on the date you mentioned; however, he would prefer to make this talk at such time as would permit him to leave Washington on the morning of the 23rd.
