



Dear Admiral Hillenkoetter:

It has been suggested to me by Commissioner George E. Sterling of the Federal Communications Commission that I write to you concerning recordings of the wartime radio programs of "Axis Sally" (Mildred Gillars).

I am doing graduate work in sociology, and this year I am taking a course in psychological warfare with Mr. Paul Padover. The subject interests me greatly, and I plan to do much of my graduate work in this field. I have selected for my thesis in this course a content analysis of German wartime radio propaganda — specifically, of the programs which Miss Gillars broadcast to American troops.

AT It is necessary, therefore, that I secure transcriptions of such broadcasts. While overseas, I was a constant listener to the "Axis Sally" programs, and I wrote an article on them for the Infantry Journal entitled "Axis Radio Propaganda in Tunisia." Now I would like to secure about ten or fifteen days' recordings of these programs, preferably made during the period of the Tunisian campaign (November, 1942 to May, 1943) for a more detailed and scientific analysis.



I would appreciate knowing about this as soon as possible; such a project, to be done well, will obviously be a long-time job, and I would have to get to work on it as soon as possible. I would be grateful for your cooperation.
