Reference is made to the Director's letter addressed to Rear Admiral Kiland dated August 15, 1950, concerning the application for employment of [redacted] As noted in that letter, Personnel wrote to [redacted] on 4 August about the possibility of employment as an Editorial Clerk. [redacted] did not reply to this letter until 28 August. In the meantime, the position for which she was being considered has been filled.

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Since [redacted] states in her letter of 28 August that she is definitely not interested in a stenographic position, we have nothing available for her at the moment in the professional field and she is being so notified. Her application is being kept in our active files for future reference.

Dear Kiland:

Since receiving your note of 11 August I have looked into the present status of the application of [redacted]

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I find that there has apparently been considerable negotiation going on since her first expression of interest some months ago, and that on 26 April she was requested by letter to let us know whether she would be interested in a stenographic position at a salary of \$3100 per year. I am informed that we heard nothing further from her until July of this year when she came in to see me, at which time she talked to our personnel people and stated that she was not interested in a secretarial job but desired editorial work.

Since that time we have found that there is a possibility of her employment as an editorial clerk, and on 4 August we requested her by letter to come in at her convenience to discuss this possibility.

There is a considerably broader field for foreign assignment in her case in a secretarial position. Foreign editorial positions at the experience level which she possesses are relatively rare. However, this whole matter will be discussed with her when she comes in for further interview.

You may be sure we will do all we can for [redacted] within the limitations imposed by her desire for a specific type of assignment.
