Dear General Smith:

For more than a month now I have been weighing what to do with a vitally important matter. This matter developed while I was in Cuba during the month of May checking on some material related to subversive activity.

I am holding what I believe to be a possible relief of our situation with Soviet Russia. There are two men involved. One is Andres P. Golovchenko, a man always anti-Communist in thought, words and action. The other man is a very brilliant scientist. He is Dr. Walter Blomquist, author of a book called "HOMONOMIA" which means "Science of Man".

I have known Mr. Golovchenko since May 1948. In all of my conversations with him I have never tripped him once. He is very accurately anti-Communist. (You have the means to check on him, and what I say.)

I have known Dr. Blomquist since May 1950. Neither have I been able to trip him during conversations. These two men, or perhaps better to say the three of us, believe that a Russian attack against this country is imminent. The three of us believe that something can be done to ward off this terrible possibility.

"HOMONOMIA" is published in Spanish. A translation could be had in four or five days. But more important is an understanding of the contents of "HOMONOMIA" and Dr. Blomquist is the best man qualified for this. Very shortly I will be able to finance the expenses of these two men. I am hoping to receive remunerations from possibly Life Magazine

the newsreels, newspapers and possibly a publisher, as a result of some very important material, which I have been checking now for nearly nine weeks.

I have no objection to helping these men, plus the costs of the translation of the book by Dr. Blomquist. But I am limited to action only for the moment.

What I am asking of you is an interview, not to last more than ten minutes. I need someone who will look.....and see, and listen.....and hear. I had rather not deal with any subordinate. The past experiences on this is a memory of disappointments. Ten minutes General, and you may get the surprise of your life. I'm only trying to help my country. Golovchenko and Blomquist are the same type of men. We are only asking that you will look at what we have.

I will be in Washington early Monday morning, the 7th. I will be at National Republic Magazine from 9:30 until 10:30, and can be reached there. I will try during the day to reach you by phone.

In the interests of the security of my country and the problems of national defense, I am,


