
Dear Beedle:

I was desperately sorry to miss you when I was in Washington. I received a call from your office the last day I was in Washington, but somebody in G-3 failed to get the name properly and I could not find out who called me. I had to leave for California without finding out what the dope was that you had for me. You were in Key West visiting the President at the time.

This note is to let you know that I am definitely interested and would like some way of finding what action on my part would be necessary and what type of operation I would engage in. I have spent long hours at this job and it is in good shape despite the failure on the part of General Staff Sections in Washington to appreciate the importance of the dignity of high ranking positions in foreign lands. Not knowing what type of operation I would engage in, I do not know what special qualifications or lack of them that pertain to me and that I should present to you. I do have very fine contacts in




The above may be superfluous, but I thought I would set it down so that in case it fit any of your operations, you could weigh it for whatever it was worth.
