

Your Honour, dear General,

allow me to express my admiration for your courage and frankness in openly admitting how "adroit and adept" the reds are and how careful you have to be about their infiltrations.

Before World War II I was a successful industrialist in Dalmatia, Yugoslavia.- During the War I was a member of the Royal Yugoslav Government in exile, in 1943 in Cairo, in 1944 in London.-

The reds are the direct cause of my being in the United States. On my shoulders there are now 28, twenty-eight ^{years} of sufferings caused by them. More worries have still to come because no all of my family and my nation are so lucky as I am to be in this country.

During the long and crucial experience of terror I acquired a sort of an animal sense of self-defence and with it a special remnant smell of their infiltrators.

Wishing to help you in your difficult job, I enclose herein two letters sent to the New York Times:
"Tito-Trieste-Totalitarianism", dated September 11th,
"Cruising 'ism's'", dated September 22nd.,
and returned to me unprinted.
May be you will find something interesting in the letters as well^{ed} in the retourning of them.

I shall be only glad to be at your disposition with further explanations which could help you in your difficult but noble task.
