Subject: Telegram to PSB from Sen. Ferguson.

1. Attached herewith is a copy of a telegram which the Psychological Strategy Board has just received from Senator Ferguson. It may be brought up at tomorrow's PSB luncheon.

2. In view of the nature of this telegram and the fact that Senator Ferguson is in Detroit and is not expected back in Washington until after the election, it might be best to inform the Senator that much of the material necessary to answer his questions is highly classified and a detailed reply should await an opportunity to discuss the matter personally with the Senator when he returns to Washington.

3. However, in view of the fact that the orientation of this telegram appears to be political, in order to stave off attack on PSB, the Board may wish to consider a general reply to questions 1, 2, 4, 6, 7 and 10.

Department--what percentage by the Pentagon? *classified.*


9. What percentage of projects recommended by the Board
