SENT DEPARTMENT 1479. DEPARTMENT PASS INFO LONDON 232.

In considering question restrictions on travel Soviet Diplomats US, Department may wish to take into account fact that yesterday Embassy officers refused tickets for travel Yakutsk (Yakutskaya ASSR) and Shcherbakov (Yaroslavl'skaya Oblast of RSFSR). Sensible reason was that travel facilities overtaxed but Embassy officers told plainly tickets would not be forthcoming for these points in future.

Noteworthy that Yakutsk and Shcherbakov are located in so-called "open" area to which travel theoretically permitted in terms MIA note 1150/IR September 30, 1948 (EMBUSE 716, October 2, 1948).

Embassy making applications for travel other "open" areas near future and will keep Department advised results.
