

SUBJECT: GMDS and SDS

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General Chamberlin proposes that GMDS and SDS, the library and document exploitation responsibilities, be transferred to CIG as of 1 April 1946. - 7

The present strength of SDS is six officers, forty-four civilians, and five enlisted personnel. The present strength of GMDS (which is primarily a library operation) is five officers and 15 enlisted personnel. Therefore, the problem of transfer of personnel should offer no serious problem.
