SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO.



- Alfonso XIII named Don Juan as general legatee of his estate, with the obligation to provide pensions for Alfonso's other children. Don Juan inherited a fortune at the death of his father amounting to about 80,000,000 pesetas, almost all of it coming from the estate of his grandmother Maria Cristina, who had prudently invested it in Switzerland in Swiss francs and in the US in dollars. The Pretender also owns property in Spain from the royal patrimony, his rights to which were respected by the Republic, as they are by the present regime. One of the most profitable investments is in the Madrid Metropolitano (transportation system).
- Ten truckloads of furniture which were transferred about mid-November 1948 from the Miramar Palace in San Sebastian to Don Juan's new establishment in Estoril were the property of Don Juan, having belonged to Maria Cristina, and were not a gift from FRANCO, although transported in official Spanish trucks.
