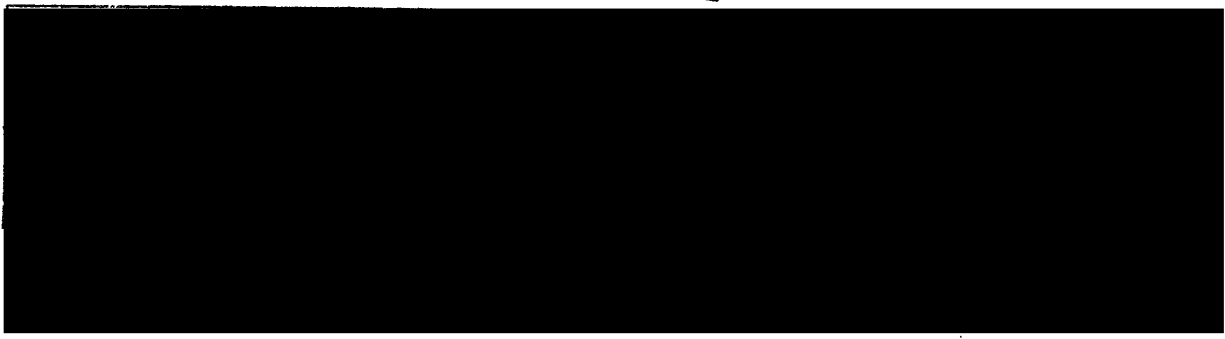

The main Directorate for the Chemical Industry of the People's Republic of Serbia, which is located in Belgrade, manages the following enterprises:

- 1. Zorka, a chemical factory in Sabac, which produces the following chemical products:

- acid for batteries
- barium carbonate
- barium sulphate
- chlorosulphate acid
- magnesium chloride
- sodium bisulphide in solution
- sodium sulphate without water
- sodium sulphate in crystals
- sodium sulphite in crystals
- sodium sulphite for photographic use
- sodium trisulphate
- plumbol powder (a lead compound)
- hydrochloric acid (sona kiselina)
- sulphuric acid (sumperna kiselina).

This factory also manufactures the following products for plant preservation:

- arsenol (sic: possibly arsenolite)
- cupricarb (kuprikar) - cupric carbonate?
- copper lime (cuprichydroxide)
- barium chloride
- calcium arsenate
- nicotinel
- lead arsenate
- pepein powder (sic - potash?)
- bluestone
- sumberite (a sulphur product)
- sumporol (a sulphur product).

2. The Zorka chemical factory in Subotica, which produces superphosphates.
3. The Albus chemical and soap factory in Novi Sad, which produces a cleansing powder called "novon".
4. The Merima chemical factory in Krusevac, which produces a cologne water and tooth paste.
5. The Duga (Rainbow) color factory at 78 Djure Djakovica Street, Belgrade, which produces all kinds of color pigments from clays; glazes; fireproof silicate pigments and silicates for anti-aircraft defense camouflage; bituminous colors and some tin alloys.
6. The Milos Mamic compressed gas and chemical products factory, which produces glue and water glass. The military section of this factory produces poisonous gases, tear gas, asphyxiating or lethal gas and artificial fog or smoke.
7. The Paper Factory in Belgrade (Fabrika Papira), which produces various kinds of paper and pasteboard.
8. The Serbian Glass Factory (Srpska Fabrika Stakla) in Paracin, which produces various sized bottles and other commercial glass articles.
9. The Glass Factory (Industrija Stakla) in Pancevo, which produces rolled glass 4 to 6 mm. thick, and other glass articles.
10. The Galenika Pharmaceutical Factory in Zemun, which produces saccharin and packs it in small containers.
11. The Southern Asbestos (Jugoazbest) Factory, which produces filter material, isolating material and shoe polish.
