25X1 3. Action: Agreed that the agency representatives now convened on [] (see IAC-M-139, para. 5) would take the G-2 paper under consideration.

25X1 4. Discussion: General Willems circulated a paper bearing on the planners' needs for an estimate on possible Chinese courses of action in Indochina. It was felt that it would be better for the IAC to meet this need than for the agencies to respond individually. It was suggested that the assumptions used for [] above might, with some variation, be valid for this estimate. General Willems undertook to explore this with the requesters, as well as the scope of the related estimate.
