The Chairman and Mr. Cumming commented on recent developments in Haiti, particularly on the question of the extent of any evidence of anti-American sentiment or of other developments inimical to US interests.

After General Collins inquired regarding the situation in Syria, the Chairman referred to possible moves by certain left-oriented Syrian elements and the probable nature and purpose of any such moves.

Admiral Frost also informed the members briefly on plans for surveillance of Soviet ships sailing from the Black Sea.


3. NIE 100-6-57
