The members discussed recent political and military developments in Syria, both with respect to their impact on the Syrian internal situation and the possible reactions of other countries in the area, such as Israel and Turkey. The members also discussed reports regarding alleged Syrian actions against US aircraft. In addition, reference was made to King Hussein's reported plans to travel from Jordan at an early date.

- c. Indonesia

The members exchanged views on the Indonesian situation, particularly in the light of Sukarno's recent speech.

between these publications and NIE's, the Chairman stated, and the members concurred, that any such study should not be disseminated until after the related NIE had been published and the SEC paper conformed with the NIE. The members then approved this report, noting, however, that objective "b" was still under consideration by the SEC members.

4. Review of Priority National Intelligence Objectives
(Economic - IAC-D-50/10.2, 5 August; International Communism - IAC-D-50/11, 18 April and IAC-D-50/11.1, 4 June; Scientific and Technical - IAC-D-50/8, 5 March)

The members approved the proposed Priority National Economic Intelligence Objectives. They also approved the draft Priority National Intelligence Objectives in the field of International Communism, subject to the deletion of the word "particularly" from paragraphs I, a, 2 and I, b, 2.

The members also agreed that these two sets of priority objectives, as approved, and the Priority National Scientific and Technical Intelligence Objectives (IAC-D-50/8) were consistent with the over-all Priority National Intelligence Objectives (DCID 4/6).







6. Report of Ad Hoc Weapons
System Study Committee
9 August 1957

[redacted] outlined the nature of the Committee's approach to this problem, various of the questions encountered in the course of their study and the reasons for the specific recommendations made in the report. After discussing various aspects of this matter in considerable detail the members noted the report and approved the recommendations of the Committee, subject to the insertion of "possible" before "use" in the first line of recommendation No. 3 and the addition of a subparagraph (e) in recommendation No. 4 to read: "Determine the security implications". It was also agreed that [redacted]

[redacted] should act as Chairman of the "Soviet Weapons Requirements Committee" established under the recommendations, and that this group should proceed in the light of comments by the IAC members and report back to the IAC no later than 31 October.

7. Executive Session

At 1140 the Chairman requested an executive session. In the course of this session, the Chairman advised that General Norstad and General Schuyler, in a recent conversation with Mr. Dulles, had discussed the extent to which the "NOFORN" classification used on intelligence data created difficulties for them in keeping NATO adequately informed. General Norstad indicated that he would like to exchange views with the IAC members on this matter during his next trip to Washington. IAC members were requested in the meantime to attempt remedial measures.
