

Approved as written. With reference to item 2b,  advised the members that he proposed to submit for consideration at an early IAC meeting a brief preliminary report on the kind of work already being done on analysis of Bloc press and radio propaganda.

2. Situation Review

a. Watch Committee Report  
No. 419

Noted. In this connection General Cabell referred to the problems which had arisen as a result of the extensive and increasing use of a NOFORN classification on intelligence information, particularly that originating in the Far East. After discussion, the members concurred in the Chairman's suggestion that the IAC agencies look into this matter and attempt to remedy this matter.

b. Review of Sensitive Situations

The Chairman noted that he proposed to circulate a Board of National Estimates memorandum on the Iranian situation, to be used as a basis for discussion at the next IAC meeting. The members then discussed factors bearing on this situation, particularly with respect to matters such as internal stability and the possibility of a coup.

The members reviewed developments in the Taiwan Strait situation, especially reports regarding movement or deployment of Chinese Communist military forces and the problem of obtaining advance warning of a Chinese Communist attack in the area.

Mr. Cumming referred to Sukarno's recent speech and the members discussed it and certain other matters bearing on the Indonesian situation. The members also exchanged views on developments in Laos.

Mr. Cumming commented on the possible implications of the recent Nasser-Faisal communique.

It was agreed that, subject to certain amendments, a draft memorandum circulated at the meeting should be forwarded to the Director, USIA.

d. Agreed to release this estimate to USIA.

8. NIE 11-5-58  
Soviet Capabilities in Guided  
Missiles and Space Vehicles

a. Approved as amended. It was also agreed that the Problem, Foreword, Conclusions and Simplified Tabular Summary be published separately, as well as in the bound copy of the finished estimate.

b. Agreed (in executive session) that Mr. Cumming might show a copy of this estimate to the Director, USIA, for his personal information.
