1. Report of Ad Hoc Committee  
on Communications\*  
(IAC-D-6/17.1, 2 April)

The members approved the Committee's report as amended, including recommendations that:

- a. The DCI send the letter in Annex E to the Secretary of Defense for his guidance, expressing the intelligence community's requirements for the transmission of critical intelligence;
- b. The draft DCID in Annex F, covering the definition, identification and handling of critical intelligence, be issued.

The members further agreed, with the USCIB representatives concurring, to the Acting Chairman's proposal that the Ad Hoc Committee be succeeded by a Standing Committee of the same components (i. e., IAC, NSA, Defense, and NIC representatives, under the chairmanship of [ ] CIA) entitled the Committee on Critical Communications (CCC), to consider the intelligence and communications aspects of the critical intelligence reporting system and provide continuing guidance to the Executive Agent for Communications, and that this committee would be available for consultation by the Secretary of Defense and officers designated by him to cope with the intelligence communications problem. In addition, the members agreed that as initial assignments the CCC would maintain continuous cognizance of intelligence handling procedures and would draft messages instructing Defense, State, and CIA representatives at specified overseas locations to produce joint recommendations for the handling of critical intelligence communications originating at those locations.

They approved the committee chairman's proposal that a letter be transmitted to the Deputy Secretary of Defense expressing the view of the IAC that further delay in authorizing the financing of a certain project could have a most serious adverse effect on the Intelligence Community's ability to determine Soviet progress in the field of guided missiles.
