This is a brief report on the progress of the Study Group. We spent a very interesting two days [Redacted] which had been well organized under [Redacted] direction. We heard not only from all of the people associated with the embassy, but also from representatives of the commands. [Redacted]

We were, and I should add that I personally am, concerned about the intelligence support to EUCCOM. At the present time they receive [Redacted] plus some representative material sent to [Redacted] for the attention of EUCCOM. Strictly from a public relations point of view, the agency could benefit greatly if a set-up similar to CINCPAC were arranged for EUCCOM and it could be done without any additional personnel [Redacted] From the point of view of the business, I am surprised that EUCCOM has not insisted on receiving our take from all other countries under their cognizance. As I cabled yesterday, I recommend that this receive our earnest consideration.

We also plan to look much more fully at the SSO system upon our return as this seems to cut across many party lines, without any appreciable benefit.
