P'yongyang hosts international conference for denuclearization, peace and anti-imperialist solidarity in the Asian-Pacific region. North Korean press claims 61 delegations representing organizations from over 50 countries⁵ and 11 international organizations attend. GFTUK Chairman Kim Pong-chu delivers report denouncing US presence in South Korea. While both resolution and communique issued at conclusion of conference echo standard North Korean policies, the resolution adds a denunciation of Seoul's military preparations to safeguard the 1988 Seoul Olympics.
