1. Final, corrected "schlussrechnung" for this project covering period from 1 December 1951 through 31 December 52. His figures are now in substantial agreement with ours; difference, at first glance, appears to be only 30 DM and, in fact, in our favor!
 2. Separate, regular accounting for December - data also included in schlussrechnung as noted above.
 3. Overt books of the Gesellschaft for Dec - these to be returned to him after inspection.
 4. Copies of receipts for all brochure costs during life of project - to substantiate his own figures on this matter.

5. Special report, prepared at my request, on his impressions of way this project has been handled and his suggestions as to how it might have been improved.

Agent reported:

1. Gesellschaft has not yet succeeded in finding a new source of funds to permit it to stay in operation. Bonn government definitely will not pick them up - neither Blank office nor Lenz. Bundesverband der Deutschen Industrie has eyes on election campaign and money for the coalition parties...but none for the Gesellschaft.
2. Sole favorable prospect at the moment is not an encouraging one. RNSPLUNT says Gen. Felix Steiner has informed Vorstand that he has hopes of getting money for them from the "Gesellschaft fuer Neue Staatspolitik" of Ulm. I am not familiar with background of this organization, but RNSPLUNT says it is a nationalistic/rightist group, critical of Adenauer, and politically ambitious. It would like to beef itself up with "front generation" recruits and ex-officers and, if possible, get into the Federal elections, perhaps by temporarily associating some of its people with the Deutsche Partei. If it thus gets any of its people into the Bundestag, idea would be to later have these split off from DP to form nucleus of a new radical rightist party - all this according to RNSPLUNT. He said that Steiner may very well be talking thru his hat (as he has often done) and that nothing may come of this. But if it should develop, SPLUNT said both he and Von Kleist would immediately quit the Gesellschaft - they want nothing to do with the Staats Politik group. I got the impression that others of the Vorstand probably...(See notes sectio

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(3) Case Officer instructed Agent:

1. Since I was unable to draw the 6,915 DM needed to terminate this project at this meeting, as scheduled, I was forced to tell him that his termination salary for 3 months, plus that of the office secty. and the funds for terminating office rent contract would not be ready until January ~~14th~~ 16th; thus another meeting should be held on that date.

Told him I had done my best to see if he could fit into other work with us but that fact he is rather generally known or suspected of having had American contact made another assignment regrettably impossible. He took this very well, said he understood and "you are quite right" and thanked me for trying on his behalf.

NOTES

1. I cannot help but feel that Steiner is probably exaggerating his ability to raise enough money from Staatspolitik organization to keep the GfW active as an organization. Such a development as outlined above would be deplorable, but we are in no position now to do anything about it. My personal feeling is that the GfW will fold up completely within next month or two.
