

Immigration and Naturalization Service records further disclosed her husband, Jonas, was born on January 21, 1904 at Kaunas, Lithuania and his present residence was listed as 6 Cite Joli Paris, France. The petition for Immigration Visa was approved on February 26, 1957, and the main file on the above information has been forwarded to Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington, D.C.

A review of the Voters Registration for Cook County Illinois disclosed that John R. Dainauskas, 4355 South Rockwell, Chicago, Illinois, was listed as a registered voter of Precinct 34, Ward 12, as of November, 1956.

On October 3, 1957, Mrs. Dolores Coffey, Chicago Credit Bureau, Incorporated, Chicago, Illinois, advised from records that Leokadija has been known to be residing at 4355 South Rockwell, Chicago, Illinois since February 7, 1957. She related that Dainauskas was formerly from Omaha, Nebraska, that her employment is listed with the St. Mary of Nazareth Hospital, Chicago, as a practical nurse. Credit records carried Dainauskas' marital status as a widow.

Mrs. Theresa Niski, Instructor of Auxiliary Personnel, Nursing Service Office, St. Mary of Nazareth Hospital, 1120 North Leavitt Avenue, Chicago, advised on October 16, 1957 that Leokadija Dainauskas has been employed as a practical nurse in the Pediatrics Division of the hospital since May 15, 1956 to present date. She advised her records disclose that Dainauskas resides at 4355 South Rockwell having telephone number LA 3-6545. A review of the records disclosed the following information regarding Dainauskas:

Mrs. Niski related she was personally acquainted with Leokadija Dainauskas. She stated that she was a religious and respected person. Her service to date as a practical nurse has been satisfactory and hospital records contain nothing unfavorable regarding Mrs. Dainauskas.

The records of the Chicago Police Department were checked on October 23, 1957 without locating any information identifiable with Leokadija or Jurate Dainauskas.

On October 23, 1957, T-2 advised their records contained no information identifiable with Leokadija or Jurate Dainauskas.

The records of the Chicago Office contained no information identifiable with the names Leokadija or Jurate Dainauskas or Mrs. John Dainauskas or Leokadija Narcevicus or Narcevicute.
