JONAS DAINAUSKAS,
with aliases

A confidential source abroad determined from T-1 that Jonas Dainauskas had denied ever being a Communist or acting as a Russian agent. Dainauskas furnished the following information concerning articles which had been written by him:

Issue No. 4, 1957, page 161, under name S. Rimvydas in the bi-monthly publication of the Lithuanian Student Scout Association, 1260 1 So. Stewart St., Chicago, Ill., captioned "Skautybe Kasdienai." Subject's son, R. Dainauskas, is listed as one of the editors of this publication.

On January 20, 1958, T-2, of unknown reliability but who is in the position to know, advised that Mrs. Leokadija Dainauskas has resided with her son John, age about 22 or 23, and daughter Jurate at 4355 South Rockwell, Chicago, for almost two years. This source stated that Mrs. Dainauskas' son John is presently attending Loyola University in Chicago, Illinois. This source added that he considers the Dainauskas family to be good Americans and desirable neighbors and stated they hold a good reputation in the neighborhood.

On January 30, 1958, Thomas P. Galarneault, Assistant Dean, School of Medicine, Loyola University, 706 South Wolcott Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, advised from records that John R. Dainauskas, born December 9, 1930 at Kaunas, Lithuania, began studying at Loyola University Liberal Arts School in June, 1956, to the present. He said that Dainauskas had been recently accepted to the School of Medicine at Loyola University and will begin his studies to become a medical doctor in September of 1958.

According to records under his control, Mr. Galarneault advised that John R. Dainauskas attended St. Mary Cathedral High School, Grand Island, Nebraska, 1949-1950; attended Creighton University, Omaha, Nebraska, from September, 1950 to spring of 1953; is a United States citizen, and is an Army veteran. His records further reveal that John R. Dainauskas has a draft classification of 4A (Army veteran) and registered with Local Board 29, city not shown, and is assigned Selective Service Number 25-29-30-676. John Dainauskas' parents are listed as mother Leokadija Dainauskas, office worker, father name not shown, occupation lawyer in Lithuania.

According to school records, John R. Dainauskas resides at 4355 South Rockwell Avenue, Chicago 32, Illinois, and he listed membership with following organizations: Lithuanian Student Association, Lithuanian Student Scouts Association and United States Army Reserve. It is noted that Dainauskas wears eye glasses, according to records. Mr. Galarneault advised that his records contained nothing unfavorable regarding John R. Dainauskas.

On January 14, 1958, records of the Naturalization Office, United States District Court, Chicago, were checked without locating any record of R. or John R. Dainauskas.

On January 15, 1958, records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service and Chicago Credit Bureau, Inc., were checked without locating any record identifiable with R. or John R. Dainauskas.

On January 16, 1958, T-3, an agency which collects security information in the Chicago area, advised that a check of their records failed to contain any identifiable information regarding R. or John R. Dainauskas.

The records of the Chicago Office failed to disclose any identifiable information regarding R. or John R. Dainauskas or S. Rimvydas.
