Subj is successor to Ernst ZOLLING, as intelligence advisor to the Egyptians.

Born Buegerhof (Oldenburg) 25 Jan 1910, with passport #1325/52, issued at Dusseldorf 3 May 1952. Travelled by train from his residence in Germany to Zurich, then by TWA 14 Jan 54. Took utmost precautions to keep his name from becoming known to any travel agency, ticket office or hotel management. Explained to confidante he wished avoid attention of British occupation authorities in Germany, and this is why he did not travel air all the way.

Wife, three daughters believed to have joined him in Cairo.

(wife is Liselotte nee HENTSCHEL, born 19 Jan 1909, with passport #5082558, issued Muelheim/Ruhr. Daughters are Ingrun, Grauke, Gisela.)

SUBJ was recruited by Wilhelm VOSS, head of Ger Advisory Group, 12 Nov or Dec 53. Broke his leg before leaving Ger, but has recovered. Assigned to the Ministry of Interior. In 1944/45 SUBJ was an official in a Berlin security office, probably Section IV of the Reichssicherheitshauptamt (Ger Security Service) and possibly holder of an SS rank. One of his friends in the RSHA was Dr. HUPPENKOTEN. It is unlikely that SUBJ will be able to complete his assignment alone, and it is believed that he will have the official or unofficial assistance of HUPPENKOTEN or one of Huppenkoten's former staff members with whom he has kept in contact.

Dr. (Lawyer) Hamel (?) DAEUMLING arrived in Egypt c. 6 mos. ago. Intelligence advisor to Director of Military Intelligence, Egyptian Army. Both Egyptians and subject kept his arrival in Egypt a secret. When asked about his work, he always said he worked for Minister of Social Affairs. Ex-SS officer, excellent education and pleasing personality. Source describes his duties as keeping Director of Mil. Intelligence clear on matters of international law so that Eg. Army may not contravene such laws. (Source: Major B. BERTENS)
