Kozma Moja

Based upon available information and/or investigation, Kozma Moja, the Second Secretary of the Albanian United Nations Mission, is considered to be connected with the Albanian Intelligence Service.

On February 4, 1971, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past reported that in a recent conversation with an Albanian emigre in New York City, the following items were discussed by Moja:

1. On the subject of the recent death of Hamza Drini in New York City, Moja stated scornfully that he felt no compassion for the man or his family. He mentioned that he had heard that there was only a slight representation by the New York Chapter of the Legality Party (OKLL) at the ceremonies preceding and following the burial of Drini. Moja commented that this was strange and wondered why the OKLL did not at least hold a funeral dinner in honor of Drini. The emigre was aware that Hamza Drini had been a past chairman of the Executive Council of the OKLL - an Albanian political party in exile - a former major in the Albanian Army prior to the Communist takeover, a declared criminal in the eyes of the communist government of Albania, and an elder and recognized leader of the Albanian emigre colony in New York City. Moja stated that there was, for sure, something wrong between Drini and the OKLL and that he would like to know exactly what.

2. Moja mentioned that he was deeply interested in the current activities within the ranks of the Balli Kombetar (Agrar) Party, or Agrarian Party, another Albanian political party in exile and which is headed by Abas Ermenji, a resident of France. Moja has heard that this party is raising large sums of money and is attempting to increase its political leverage by having its leaders seeing congressmen and trying to influence the State Department of the United States. Moja wondered how much success the Agrarian Party has had so far in this regard, what its aims are, and also whether the United States Government is giving any special consideration, especially financial support, to this group.

3. Moja also told the emigre that he had received information that Xhaver Deva, the President of the League of Prizren (LP), would not continue as president for the following year. Moja's information was that Deva was no longer active in LP affairs and would not seek re-election as leader. The emigre was aware that the LP is a group of Albanian emigres who are primarily concerned with the rights and welfare of ethnic Albanians living in the Kosovo area of the Serbian Republic of Yugoslavia and where these Albanians constitute a large cultural minority. Moja told the emigre that he was interested in every phase of activity in all the various Albanian emigre groups and parties.
