MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, E/G

SUBJECT: Visit of CARAVEL

1. This memorandum records my part in the entertainment and briefing of CARAVEL, who visited Washington from 10 to 12 September 1968.

2. At about 1900 hours on 10 September, after ascertaining CARAVEL's expected time of arrival at the Ambassador Hotel, I reached him at the hotel by phone, greeted him, and asked him to dinner. (Thomas Polgar of WH Division had planned to join us downtown if dinner and evening conversation could be arranged.) CARAVEL said that he was very tired from his flight from Paris and that he was suffering a troublesome allergic reaction to a penicillin shot he had been given in Europe. He begged off for that evening. I told him that [] would pick him up at his hotel in the morning for a discussion of the records problem as he had requested.

3. At 1230 on 11 September 1968 [] brought CARAVEL to the 1789 Restaurant, situated between the Georgetown University campus and the International Police Academy. There the following group assembled for lunch:


Thomas Polgar, WH, a former case officer of CARAVEL

Lunch was mainly social. Cost, including tip, paid by me \$34. CARAVEL was still suffering from his allergy, and so after lunch [] returned to Headquarters and acquired an anti-allergy remedy from the medics which was brought by a CI Staff courier to the Police Academy. (Relief was prompt.)

4. After lunch CARAVEL, [] proceeded on foot to the Police Academy, where [] introduced CARAVEL to the Director, Michael McCann, and to Adolphe Bonnefil, a member of the faculty. An intensive briefing on the Academy was then given to CARAVEL in French, and this was followed by a conversation on world-wide police problems between CARAVEL and McCann. I left about 1730 to return to Headquarters, and CARAVEL went on with Mr. McCann to meet Byron Engle, Director of Public Safety for AID, for dinner and a night of further shop-talk.

5. On 12 September 1968 [] C/FI/OPS, another former case officer, picked up CARAVEL at his hotel and brought him home [] house, Bethesda) for drinks at the end of the day. [] then delivered CARAVEL to the Linden Inn, where [] and I met him and fed him dinner. After dinner we had drinks and conversation at my house in Bethesda, and [] then drove CARAVEL back to his hotel. He was scheduled to depart for California and Europe the following morning. Most of the conversation this evening was in French, with [] using the occasion to cover various political and security subjects of which CARAVEL has knowledge. (Cost of dinner, again exactly \$34.)

6. I had been asked to ask CARAVEL about his (CAMEN's) training of Afghan police officers. CARAVEL said that a considerable number of Afghans attended the CAMEN school and that they were the brightest, best prepared and linguistically best qualified of all foreign students attending. He also said they always seemed to have just completed an equivalent course behind the curtain or planned to proceed from his school to one behind the curtain. (He said literally the USSR, but I think he meant the Bloc generally.)

7. Expenses: 34 x 2: 68 bucks. The RID chaps may wish to claim mileage to and from the safe house as well.
