1. Since there could well be complications with the Canadian Service if I were to write to Subject with regard to his coming to the U.S., I feel that it is best if you handle the arrangements in the ~~following~~ manner set forth below.

2. I want you to write Subject that "things seem to be going well" and that you expect to be taking a vacation trip to Canada in the near future and hope to see ^{him on your way thru Toronto} ~~it~~ ~~be managed~~.
(and give approximate dates which should be during 1-15 March)

3. Then, I would like for you and your wife to take a 3-5 day "vacation" in Canada, visiting either Montreal or Quebec, and stopping for a day on your return in Toronto. While there, I want you to see Subject and tell him as follows:

(a) "That you have received word from your friend in the government that he would be interested in seeing Subject for exploratory talks in the U.S., but that in order to avoid undue publicity and chance of ruining any future Subject might have, he has strongly recommended that Subject come to the U.S. entirely on his own with no mention to anyone of his real reasons. He is to prepare a cover story that will readily account for his trip, such as the fact that he would like to see an old friend, or that he is hoping to build up the circulation of his paper by visiting certain Bulgarian groups in the U.S., or that he is wondering about business opportunities in the U.S. He should then apply for his visa as a temporary visitor. When he has his visa, he

3. (Cont'd) should drop you a line, telling you that "he is expecting to see a friend of his about the ____ of _____ and will give him your regards." This is to mean that he has his visa and that he will be at the specified location on that date.

(b) You will tell him that he should come to Springfield, Massachusetts and register at the _____ Hotel, using his true name. He should plan to get there in time to meet me at 1800 that day. If he cannot be there at 1800, I shall look for him every hour thereafter, on the hour, until 2200. Failing that, I shall look for him the next morning at 1000, 1200, and 1300. If that should go wrong, he should ask at the desk for [] and call my room, but this should only be as a last resort.

(c) He should furnish you with a recent photograph of himself as aid in my identifying him.

(d) You should tell Subject that I am 5'11" tall, weigh 170 lbs, am light complexioned etc., and that I shall be wearing a single breasted charcoal (black) flannel suit and carrying a black briefcase.

(e) Subject should write you at least ten days before the date he sets as a meeting date in order for you to have time to notify me. I would like to have you set the following date for the meeting and if he can be there on that date, he need not do more than confirm it to you: ~~22 April~~ 22 April.

(f) You will be provided with two hundred dollars in cash which you are authorized to give him ^{against a receipt} if he absolutely has to have it for his trip expenses. If not needed, I would prefer for you not to give it to him, but tell him that I will reimburse him when I see him.
