2. THERE WERE APPROXIMATELY 1,000 EMPLOYEES AT THE INSTITUTE BEFORE 1973. AFTER 1973, THERE WERE APPROXIMATELY 300 WORKERS AT THE SOUTHERN STATE SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH DESIGN INSTITUTE FOR OIL PRODUCTION; HOWEVER, IN 1979 THE INSTITUTE INCREASED ITS PERSONNEL TO 600 EMPLOYEES. THE DIRECTOR OF THE INSTITUTE PRIOR TO 1973 WAS ((BANDORCHUK)) WHOSE NICKNAME WAS "FUHRER." AFTER THE INSTITUTE WAS SEPARATED BANDORCHUK REMAINED AS THE DIRECTOR OF THE ALL SOVIET GAS DESIGN INSTITUTE. THE DEPUTY FOR THIS INSTITUTE WAS ALSO IN CHARGE OF THE ECONOMIC/DOMESTIC SERVICES DEPARTMENT WHICH WAS MADE UP OF SUPPLY PERSONNEL AND OTHER WORKERS. THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR WAS ELENA IVANOYNA ((RUONEVA)). THE MAIN ENGINEER OF ALL THE PROJECTS AT THAT INSTITUTE WAS SAMUIL RUVIMOVICH ((KHOFFMAN)). ALL OF THE THREE ABOVE SERVED WITH THE SOVIET GAS DESIGN INSTITUTE FROM 1944 THROUGH 1973. THE FIRST DEPARTMENT/PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT (OTDEL KADROV) WAS HEADED BY COLONEL ((MELANICH)) WHO AFTER 1973 STILL REMAINED WITH THE GAS INSTITUTE.
