Pei-k'o (貝克): Captain, 29 Regiment.

Shih-lai-te (世萊得): Major.

Ta-erh-ti (大爾弟): Air Force Lieutenant.

B-3 2. As of mid-July about 30 American prisoners of war were housed in a villa of CH'EN Chia-t'ang at P'ung P'ung. Two meals daily of the same food Chinese Communist prisoners receive and two being given daily to the Chinese Communist prisoners. The garrison was drawn from the garrison regiment of 15 Army Group Command Headquarters.

F-6 3. The Chinese Communist 4 Field Army under the command of LIN Piao has selected a group of United Nations prisoners of war who can speak Mandarin or Cantonese and sent them to Canton.² About 128 such prisoners have arrived in Canton, including 13 Americans, 8 British, and 103 South Koreans. More than 40 were in the first group of arrivals, and the remainder came later in another group. The American and British prisoners are confined in the former USIS office in Shameen, Canton. They are restricted to the building, but are receiving

good treatment. The South Koreans are not treated as well as the British and Americans. No official or unofficial information concerning the prisoners has been disclosed by the Chinese Communist authorities, but it is believed that they are to be used for propaganda purposes.

1. [REDACTED] Comment. [REDACTED] for the supplementary report on American prisoners of war at #35, Lane 1136, Yuyuen Road, Shanghai.
 2. [REDACTED] Comment. [REDACTED] reported the use of Chinese-speaking United Nations' prisoners of war for street demonstrations in Canton. The field comments that it is unlikely that United Nations' prisoners could be used for propaganda purposes without reports of such activity appearing in the Chinese press. An officer of the Chinese Communist 15 Army Group, 4 Field Army, stationed at Shinch'i, reported there were no UN prisoners in Canton as of mid-July. However, a usually reliable source with a British point of view, who received his information from a Chinese with contacts in Mukden, has reported that 30 American prisoners of war entrained from Mukden for Pankow on 8 May 1951. The prisoners seen in Mukden were reported to be in good spirits and tidily dressed.
