Diplomatic Developments, Reactions to Suspension of Hostilities

The UN Security Council is scheduled to meet today at 1030 EST to discuss the Gulf crisis. Yesterday evening Iraqi Foreign Minister Aziz conveyed Iraq's unconditional acceptance of all 12 UN resolutions in a letter to the Security Council, according to press. [REDACTED]

Great Britain intends to reopen its embassy in Kuwait City, possibly as early as today, [REDACTED]. Turkey, Poland, and Japan also are expecting to reopen their [REDACTED]

Luxembourg's Foreign Minister told the BBC today that he was "very glad to see the war ended," and Indonesia also issued a statement welcoming the decision to suspend hostilities. In the first reported Soviet reaction, the Soviet parliament's speaker called the suspension "a great victory for the foreign policy initiative of our president," according to TASS. [REDACTED]
