# Programme of Action 1983

INTRODUCTION

The year 1983 marks a decisive stage in the worldwide struggle for the prevention of nuclear war. The peace action by the peoples, by all the anti-war forces, must reach new heights to make 1983 the year of the greatest and most unified Peace actions in the history of humanity.

Never has the danger of a nuclear conflagration and the consequent destruction of all that is most precious on this Earth, of life itself, been as great as it is today.

The Reagan Administration presses on recklessly with its plans to deploy Pershing II and Cruise missiles in Western Europe in 1983. If these plans are not halted the world will enter a qualitatively new period which may well make it virtually impossible to halt the arms race in the future.

The U.S. Defence Secretary has proudly declared that the United States is spending billions on a project for a "protracted" nuclear war with the Soviet Union. The Pentagon generals are welcome to their lunacy but the thinking behind this "project" can lead to the nuclear annihilation of all peoples.

The world has understood better than ever the perils of the arms buildup, after the genocidal war waged by Israeli ruling circles, backed by Washington, against the Palestinian and Lebanese peoples.

The cancer of nuclear war grows with every act of aggression and intervention through every hotbed of tension in the Middle East, in Southern Africa, in Central America and in Caribbean, in the Indian Ocean, in South and South East Asia and elsewhere.

The World Peace Council's Programme of Action for 1983 is a programme for mass action in every part of the world against nuclear war, for peace and life. It is a programme based on the understanding that the peoples have the power to halt the drive towards war.

1) Since this Programme of Action was adopted in Lisbon on 2nd November 1982 the Reagan Administration has proposed a new \$20 billion MX missile project which would only contravene the understandings in SALT I and SALT II but threatens an even greater new escalation in the arms race.

Never has the anti-war movement been as strong as it is today. Never have there been bigger mass demonstrations as those in May and June 1982 in support of the Second Special Session of the United Nations Devoted to Disarmament, and in protest against the NATO session in Bonn and the visit of President Reagan to Western Europe. The momentum has continued during 1982 with the actions marking United Nations Disarmament Week in October.

Freeze and reduce nuclear weapons! This demand which has swept the United States, with millions marching and voting for the Freeze is now spreading across the Atlantic to Europe and the rest of the world.

The spirit of Helsinki should be kept alive and the results of a period of peaceful coexistence and détente of the 70's should be preserved against attempts to turn it into a platform for confrontation.

The nearly one million who marched against nuclear war on October 4, 1982 in Delhi demonstrated vividly that the peace struggle today is a worldwide struggle. In Asia, Africa and Latin America hunger and poverty are a constant, grim and terrible reminder of the fact that the imperialist arms build-up has not brought about a reduction of the right even to a handful of arms the right to life today.

The Programme of Action for 1983 places in the forefront the key task of promoting the cooperation, common action and unity of all the anti-war movements and forces.

The war makers and arms profiteers unable to halt the growth in numbers of the participants in peace marches, demonstrations, rallies and other actions... seek desperately to blunt the anti-war organisations, to blunt the edge of the peace movement.

Never before has there been such an outpouring of lies and slanders, such a witch-hunt against the peace movement as there is today. In their desperation the arms profiteers are pouring more and more billions into their propaganda offensive which seeks to "justify" their arms build-up.

But the urge for cooperation and unity in the anti-war movement is stronger than ever before. And all genuine anti-war

movements are extending their hands of friendship to all others, irrespective of differences of viewpoints.

The war makers seek to create barriers between one anti-war organisation and another; they seek to create barriers between the movements in one country and another, between "East" and "West" between one continent and another.

The WPP expresses its readiness to cooperate with all forces fighting against nuclear war and for disarmament, and stresses the importance of dialogue and the promotion of understandings.

### WORLD ASSEMBLY FOR PEACE AND LIFE AGAINST NUCLEAR WAR

It is with a view to promoting cooperation and dialogue and to defeating all attempts at dividing the movement that numerous mass organisations and movements, political parties, trade unions, churches, organisations of women, youth and students, the aged, writers, artists, physicians, scientists and educators have joined together to prepare for the World Assembly for Peace and Life, Against Nuclear War, to be held in Prague from June 14 to 19, 1983.

The World Peace Council and the national organisations represented in it will devote the first half of 1983 particularly to supporting and participating in all initiatives on national, regional and international levels taken by the International Preparatory Committee for the World Assembly.

The second half of 1983 must carry forward the momentum of the mass movement... a Programme of Action for this period will undoubtedly receive new strength from the decisions of the World Assembly.

The World Peace Council's Programme of Action for 1983 is a programme of common action, cooperation and unity of all anti-war movements, all peace forces.

It is a programme of action to ensure successful and efficient negotiations for a nuclear freeze, for halting the deployment of new nuclear missiles in Europe, for establishing peace and nuclear weapon-free zones, for the banning of all weapons of mass destruction.

It is a programme of action for the ending of aggression and intervention, for political solutions of all international issues, for solidarity with all who fight for national independence and justice, for social progress and a New International Economic Order.

It is a programme for the prevention of nuclear war, for the defence and the building of peace and life.

**Note:** The implementation of the various parts of the Programme depends on the possibilities of raising adequate funds, and it may not be possible to carry out certain initiatives if the necessary resources are not available.

## PROGRAMME OF ACTION

### I. WORLD ASSEMBLY FOR PEACE AND LIFE, AGAINST NUCLEAR WAR

Prague, Czechoslovakia (June 14-19, 1983)

(Cooperation with the International Preparatory Committee of the World Assembly, and participation in all international and regional meetings organised or supported by the Committee.)

Each national movement will support and participate in common efforts by the broadest range of peace forces in the country in preparation for the World Assembly. Formation of national preparatory committees, collections for the World Assembly Fund, organising of national assemblies etc.

### II. MEETINGS OF THE LEADING AND OTHER BODIES OF THE MOVEMENT

#### i. Sessions of the Council

The retiring Council will meet in Prague on June 20, 1983 to reconstitute the Council.

The newly elected Council will then meet immediately to elect the President, the Vice-Presidents and members of the Presidential Committee.

#### ii. Sessions of the Presidential Committee

- (a) The Presidential Committee will meet in Prague on June 13, 1983 with a view to finalise proposals to be placed before the session of the Council.
- (b) The newly elected Presidential Committee will meet on June 20, 1983, to elect the new Bureau and Secretariat.

#### iii. Sessions of the Bureau of the Presidential Committee

The session of the Bureau of the WPC Presidential Committee will be held in the last quarter of 1983.

In addition, international developments may require the calling of an emergency meeting of the Bureau on a specific issue.

#### iv. Meetings of WPC Standing Commissions

Each WPC Standing Commission will meet in connection with a conference or other events, dealing with issues and problems related to the work of the Commission.

#### v. Continental and Regional Meetings of Representatives of National Movements

The following continental and regional meetings will be held in the first half of 1983:

- (a) Europe (together with USA and Canada)
- (b) Latin America and the Caribbean
- (c) Asia
- (d) West Africa
- (e) East and Southern Africa
- (f) Central Africa
- (g) Arab countries

#### vi. Meetings of Members of the WPC in Each Country

Regular meetings of members of the WPC from each country will be organised by each national movement to discuss the work of the World Peace Council, and the resolutions and statements of the Council.

### III STRENGTHENING AND BROADENING OF NATIONAL MOVEMENTS FOR A WORLDWIDE NETWORK OF PEACE ORGANISATIONS

The development of the mass anti-war movements, the preparations for the World Assembly and the growing cooperation among peace forces must lead to the organisational strengthening and broadening of all national movements - and in particular to the extension of the movements to grassroots level district state and provincial levels.

Visits by WPC delegations to different countries will focus attention on both the broadening and the deepening among the masses of the national peace movements.

#### PREVENTING NUCLEAR WAR, ENDING THE ARMS BUILD-UP, PROMOTING ELIMINATION OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS AND GENERAL AND COMPLETE DISARMAMENT

##### A. Mass Activities for the Prevention of Nuclear War:

to prevent the deployment by NATO of new intermediate range strategic weapons on the soil, seas and in the airspace of Europe.

to freeze the development, testing, production and deployment of all nuclear weapons and weapons of mass destruction, followed by rapid reduction of existing stockpiles leading to their complete elimination.

to stop the production and deployment of and to ban the neutron bomb and other neutron weapons.

to support demands for "No First Use" of nuclear weapons.

to create nuclear weapon-free and peace zones,

to exert the full weight of public opinion for the rapid successful conclusion of U.S. - Soviet Union negotiations on Strategic Nuclear Weapons.

to exert the full weight of public opinion for the rapid successful conclusions of U.S. - Soviet Union negotiations on intermediate-range nuclear missiles and forward based systems in Europe.

to continue to campaign for implementation of the decisions of the First Special Session on Disarmament (1978) as being the most comprehensive and best programme for averting nuclear war and achieving disarmament.

to expose the myth of limited nuclear war and plans for

"protracted winnable" nuclear war. To disseminate widely information on the horrors of nuclear war.

to campaign for a halt in the imperialist military build-up, direct and indirect intervention and aggression around the world as in the Middle East, Southern Africa, Central America and the Caribbean, the Indian Ocean, Asia, the South Atlantic and elsewhere.

Among the activities will be:

A Global Campaign for Peace and Life, Against Nuclear War.

Support to national and regional events, marches, demonstrations, marathons, peace relays, car and bicycle caravans, vigils, peace ship cruises, conferences, seminars, petitions and other campaigns for the prevention of nuclear war, for freezing nuclear weapons and for disarmament.

All-out support for the maximum success of the World Disarmament Campaign initiated by the Second Special Session of the U.N. General Assembly on Disarmament (1982) and to U.N. plans for the observance of the 1980s as the Second Disarmament Decade.

Full support to and participation by WPC delegations in activities, conferences, dialogues, organised by the International Preparatory Committee and National Preparatory Committees for the World Assembly for Peace and Life, Against Nuclear War, to be held in Prague, June 1983.

particularly those dealing with:

- the economic, social and psychological consequences of the arms build-up.
- The war danger and arms build-up and the struggle for peace, justice, independence, national liberation, human rights and democracy against racism and apartheid in the Middle East, Africa, Central America and the Caribbean, Latin America and Asia.
- Security and cooperation in Europe and the impact of the nuclear war danger.
- Profits derived from the production of arms as a primary propelling force in the arms build-up.
- Education for peace and disarmament.
- Conversion of military industries to peaceful production.
- Creation of peace and nuclear weapon-free zones.

**B. Further Campaigns to Stop and Reverse the Arms Build-up Against Nuclear and Other Weapons of Mass Destruction, for International Security, Cooperation and Detente**

to achieve a comprehensive ban on all nuclear weapon tests, to prevent the further production and deployment of chemical weapons and achieve a ban on chemical weapons, to achieve a ban on laser, radiological and space weaponry, weaponry, to achieve a reduction in armed forces and armaments and the dismantlement of military blocs, to strengthen and achieve the full implementation of the Non-Proliferation Treaty, to accomplish a reduction in military budgets, and conversion of arms production and all resources to peaceful purposes, to campaign for negotiations on every possible level for the reduction of the war danger, including the U.N. Security Council, and through the holding of the World Disarmament Conference called for by the U.N., to widely expose the arms build-up as a major cause of poverty, hunger, starvation, disease, unemployment and inflation and as the main obstacle to the creation of a New International Economic Order.

**C. Intensify Mobilisation of Public Opinion to Ensure Success for the Work of U.N. Bodies:**

The U.N. Disarmament Commission, the Committee on Disarmament, the U.N. Centre for Disarmament, UNIDIR, and for the disarmament and peace education work of I.N.I.S.CO.

**D. Increase Cooperation with:**

NGOs, the NCCO Special Committees on Disarmament and the Ad Hoc Liaison Group on Disarmament, the International Liaison Forum of Peace Forces.

**E. Mass Actions for the Observance of:**

U.N. Disarmament Week (October 24--31)  
International Day of Peace (third Tuesday of September)  
Week of Action (August 6-13) for the Banning of Nuclear Weapons and Solidarity with the Hibakushas  
International Women's Day (March 8) and October 25 as days of women's actions for peace and disarmament  
World Peace Day (Anniversary of the outbreak of WW II) (September 1)  
Universal Children's Day (first Monday of October) for the observance of the right of children to be free from war, the threat of war, and the economic and social consequences of the arms build-up.

**V. ACTIONS FOR SECURITY AND COOPERATION IN EUROPE AND IN SUPPORT OF THE HELSINKI FINAL ACT**

Launching of campaigns and giving full support to unity in action between different forces against the increasing danger of nuclear war, against attempts to sabotage detente or cooperation in Europe, for the success of the Madrid Conference and in favour of the implementation of all provisions of Helsinki Final Act.

**Especially emphasizing:**

Further intensification of actions against the deployment of new U.S. missiles in Europe, for constructive results of the Geneva talks and for substantial reductions of nuclear weapons in Europe.  
Actions on national and international levels against military build-up in Europe, such as deployment of toxic gas shells nuclearisation, military bases etc.,  
Actions for peace, security and cooperation in the Mediterranean, for making the Mediterranean a zone of peace.  
Campaigns for mobilising public opinion in favour of a conference on confidence-building measures within the

Give full support to national and regional events organised by the International Preparatory Committee in preparation for the World Assembly for Peace and Life. Cooperate with the United Nations, UNESCO and other U.N. bodies in their activities concerning youth and students and their problems, support to and participation in the preparation for the United Nations International Youth Year (1985). Assist and participate in the initiatives and actions of international youth and student organisations, particularly the joint campaigns for non-governmental youth organisations.
