

On 27 July 1990, over one hundred Black Muslim extremists belonging to the Jamaat al Muslimeen (JAM), or Group of Muslims, seized the Trinidad and Tobago television studio (TTT) and the Parliament building (the Red House) where they held the Prime Minister and several cabinet members hostage. After five days and at least 30 dead, Yasin Abu Bakr, the leader of the group, and 113 of his followers surrendered to Trinidadian military authorities.
