THE FAR RIGHT AND POLICE CHIEF FRANCOIS CONTINUE TO FAVOR A QUASICONSTITUTIONAL APPROACH TO SIDELINING ARISTIDE BY HAVING THE LEGISLATURE INVOKE ARTICLE 148, WHICH WOULD TRANSFER EXECUTIVE AUTHORITY TO A NEW PRIME MINISTER. [REDACTED] LEADERS OF THE RIGHTIST GROUP FRAPH REJECTED CEDRAS' REQUEST TO ATTEND THE RECENT PROMILITARY CONFERENCE, THEREBY KEEPING ITS OPTIONS OPEN TO PURSUE AN INDEPENDENT COURSE. FRAPH ALSO REPORTEDLY

FRAPH'S GROWING STRENGTH MAY IMPEL MILITARY LEADERS TO CLOSE  
THE LEGISLATURE AND TAKE OTHER ACTIONS DESIGNED TO REIN IN THE  
RIGHT. A SEIZURE OF POWER MAY RESULT IN MORE OPEN CONFLICT WITHIN  
THE MILITARY--ESPECIALLY BETWEEN THE HIGH COMMAND AND FRANCOIS--AND  
INCREASE THE LIKELIHOOD OF A REVOLT BY DISAFFECTED ELEMENTS.
