

POLAND: Work Stoppages Suspended

The willingness of striking workers in Lublin to accept lower wage increases than originally demanded, but in line with those granted other workers, apparently has cooled labor unrest there. Railroad workers in the city noted, however, that they were only "suspending" their strike pending talks on other demands. Other work stoppages elsewhere in Poland also ended over the weekend. The regime appears to be continuing its policy of granting pay increases under duress, and the many workers who have not received increases may also resort to strikes. [REDACTED]
