

USSR-POLAND: Moscow's Concern

The Soviets sent the Polish Government their first public signal of concern over Warsaw's handling of the labor unrest by downgrading their representation at the Polish national day reception in Moscow on Tuesday. In contrast to the usual Politburo-level attendance on such an occasion, the USSR was represented by only deputy chairmen of the Supreme Soviet and the Council of Ministers. Moscow may hope that such a slight will induce Warsaw to take more effective measures to end the unrest.
