

MEMORANDUM:

SUBJECT: General Lajos DALNOKI-VERESS

1. General VERESS (pronounced VERESH) is an honorable, politically conservative, anti-Communist, career Army officer, who was the ranking Hungarian on the Eastern front under Regent Miklos HORTHY during World War II. He surrendered to the Soviets in 1944 on orders from HORTHY. The general was imprisoned by the Hungarian Communists in 1946 and remained in prison until 1956, when he was released by Hungarian revolutionaries. He escaped to Western Europe in 1956.

2. General VERESS was highly respected by the emigration because of his long imprisonment, and because he did not sell out to the post-war Hungarian Communist regime. In recognition of his respected position, he was named co-chairman of a Hungarian freedom fighters' organization. The current chairman of the organization, which is now called the "Federation of Hungarian Freedom Fighters, Inc.", is Maj. Gen. Bela KIRALY, who resides in New York. Because of his imprisonment, General VERESS had little knowledge of the political, economic, and social questions surrounding the post-war Hungarian emigration;

3. Although General VERESS himself appears to be above reproach, the fact that he is under the influence of a notoriously pro-Fascist group makes it desirable to deal with him with a good deal of caution. It is extremely doubtful that the intelligence potential of General VERESS' Freedom Fighter Organization would outweigh the possible damage which might result from continued contact with him while he is closely associated with ZAKO.
