JEANNOT FORBACH - STIRING

1. Civilians, male and female, in Forbach, Stiring, and on road between Forbach and Stiring. Most men under 20 and over 35.
2. Schupo patrols on all roads vicinity of Forbach picking up civilians (men and women) to take them for digging. They ask for papers and keep papers to prevent escape.
3. At road block at BRENNÉ d'OR, guards with order to fire on anyone passing without authority. Laissez - Passer issued by army authorities and Nazi party giving exact destination, route and valid reason.
4. "Schauz - Arbester" passing back and forth on Saarbrucken and Forbach road with Laissez - Passers issued by SA supervising the "Schanzen".
5. To get into SPIGHEREN, OETING and SCHONECK, Laissez - Passer are needed. A permit issued by army unit (ordinary paper// "In Ermanglung (Lives-Dienst) stempels", signature of Lieutenant), seems to be sufficient. Lines Dienststempels
6. Very few civilians reported left in Saarbrucken.
7. MARIENAU - half of population left. Many trying to get into American side. Civilians must keep off streets except between 0700 and 0800A.
8. Agent found people willing to shelter him and to help him through lines in MARIENAU (recommends NICOLA AAR, barber).
9. Civilian morale in FORBACH area low as food conditions are bad and control of movement tightening.
