About 12 March, Monz told Speck of the capture of another Allied agent, believed to be in American service, known only as [REDACTED]. He had crossed the line, place unknown about the first of March 1945, and happened to meet a gendarme from Luetzenhausen, his own home town. He was brought to FAT 349 at Rodalben and was interrogated by Lt. Hiller. Under interrogation he said nothing except that he had been sent by the FFI. After this, he was brought to Weisenheim, to Pdo 313, where he was interrogated by Monz. At Weisenheim he was kept in a school house, guarded by five Cossacks (employed by Walter in German uniform).

After Speck's surrender, while he was in the PW cage in Trier, he was startled to discover that one of his companions in captivity was the same [REDACTED] whom he had discussed with Monz. From conversation with [REDACTED] he learned that the car in which they had left for Kreuznach had broken down, and they were obliged to proceed to Mainz on foot, accompanied by a guard of the Feldgendarmerie. At Sprendlingen, he managed to escape under cover of darkness. About 24 March, an American officer came to the PWE and took [REDACTED] away.
