

OPERATION CONCERT

Operation will be dropped about 22/2/45 near Nenhausen (sheet V-3, 7622) or a little farther East for quick access to Autobahn, Stuttgart- Pforzheim.

1) SECTION SWING will go from Pforzheim to Karlsruhe and Sarre, Nemines crossing the lines to return. She will use her own identity, carrying her Italian passport [redacted] issued to [redacted] by the Italian Consul in Strasbourg, on [redacted] extended by the same to 5/10/45 and containing an Aufenthaltserlaubnis for the Reichsgebiet issued by the Strasbourg police and valid until the same date.

On the 10th of November he went to Germany on business, taking his daughter with him. They went first to a business acquaintance [redacted] at Illersicht/Weiden (Oberpfalz) where they stayed through Christmas as they had Italian connections. From there they went to another business acquaintance, [redacted] Konstanz, leaving there the 20th of Jan. On 25/1/45 he started on a business trip to a third friend, [redacted] Pirmasens, but left his daughter in Konstanz as he feared the bombardments. By 18/2/45 he had not returned so she has set out to look for him on foot, hoping for a lift. She spends the previous night at the Red Cross at Neckerstr. 42, Stuttgart where she meets WALTZ. They are now en route Westwards together.

Besides her Italian passport and letter heads of three business acquaintances, she carries a letter from Alcampora addressed to her father in care of Borgs.

2) SECTION WALTZ - Has her own Red Cross Personalausweis issued to [redacted] and bearing stamps valid until March 1945. Also her DRK - pass issued 4/11/42 in Elberfeld. Also a letter from DRK Strasstadt transferring her to the DRK Koeln and dated 10/11/44. In Koeln she lived at [redacted] the suburb of Ehrenfeld, not far from the office [redacted]. Her house was bombed on 8/2/45 and she has a certificate to that effect issued by Polizei-Revier IV on 10/2/45. She also has a DRK armband.

She drove with a medical officer to Stuttgart immediately thereafter where she arrived the day before the drop. In the DRK Bereitschaft Neckerstr. 42 where she spent the night she met her friend SWING. Thinking that Pforzheim is less likely to be bombed than Stuttgart, she is now en route to DRK there at [redacted] to get a job.
