Ruth RAUSCHER was born in Muenchen 10-11-22. She lives at Schmidtgasse 10 with her parents. She has Kennkarte A-81472, issued 12-12-41 by the Polizeipraesident i.A., listing her as without employment. For the last two years she has worked at the Red Cross Bereitschaft at Hildegardestr. 14, ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ and has an Ausweis issued by the Kreisstelle Muenchen-Stadt 11-2-43 as a DRK-Helferin.

The work is too much for her health. She has a friend \_\_\_\_\_ who lives at \_\_\_\_\_ in Stuttgart, and it is arranged that Ruth will look after her house and children so that she can take a war job in the Daimler-Benz works.

The Fuehrerin of the Bereitschaft gives her a glowing testimonial when she ends her work on 2-2-45. She takes a rest at home from then till 28-2-45, when she hears of a truck going West in which she can get a ride. As this truck is going on to ~~Sibersau~~ Saulgau and Tuettlingen, she drops off at the Steinheim crossroads 8138 to continue North to Stuttgart. There she meets a man named [REDACTED]; they share their food, spend the night in a barn, and continue towards Buch and (S)(1) Stuttgart early in the morning of 29-2-45 in a truck which offers (S)(3) them a ride.

Rita GINKE has the same description as the above, but her Kennkarte is #A-049521 issued by the Polizei-Prasident Koeln, Revier 17, 12-12-41.
