Particular care on the security of the boys was found to be necessary in NANCY due to the rigid rules in Gen. PATTON'S kingdom. Contact was made with Col. SHELLCROSS, OSS, 3rd Army, who proved to be very cooperative. He advised us to see CIC, 3rd Army, Capt HOWLET, who appreciated the fact of our telling him of the presence in town of our two Joes.
